Opinion and Award

Aggrieved employees in the 44" Hot Strip Mill allege that Article VII Section 6 of the Agreement was violated by the Company when it listed and credited employees "with sequential seniority dates on a permanent basis when filling temporary vacancies". The relief sought is that such listing be done in accordance with the applicable terms of the Agreement.

This case involves the question of the acquisition of sequential standing by virtue of 30 turns worked on extended operations. The principles governing that question, in situations such as that presented in this case, were decided in Arbitration Nos. 167, 178, and 179. Those principles control the disposition of the issue in this case.

In view of the extensive consideration given the problem presented by this case in the other cases cited above, hearing was waived by the parties.

AWARD

The grievance is sustained, in accordance with the opinion and ruling in Arbitration No. 167.
