STATEMENT

Pursuant to notice, a hearing was held in Gary, Indiana, on April 12, 1961.

THE ISSUE


The grievance reads:

"Aggrieved employees of #1 and #2 Coil Pickler Lines, 3 to 11 and 12 to 8 crews, were scheduled to work 4 turns the week of 12/20/59. Men with less seniority worked 5 days. It must be noted that we do not have line seniority and the men move from one line to the next. Employees not established in the sequence were not taken off schedule.

Men be compensated for loss of one day's work and men not established in the sequence be taken off sequential occupations when operating at 15 turns or less."

STATEMENT

Upon the full development of the factual background of this matter, the Union withdrew this appeal.
