<u>STATEMENT</u>

Pursuant to proper notice a hearing was held in GARY, INDIANA, on April 1, 1963.

THE ISSUE

The grievance reads:

"Aggrieved employees of Welder Sequence allege a violation of Collective Bargaining Agreement when, as per established practice, no welder was scheduled on the #2 side of the Cold Strip for the 4-12 turn April 29, 1961, and that K. Carpenter, #14387, (who was scheduled as welder #1 side) had to traverse to the #2 side and #1 side to perform duties of welder. One welder is scheduled on the #1 side and one on the #2 side on the

4-12 turn as per established practice, but was not so for the turn in question. $^{\rm H}$

The relief sought reads:

"Pay available employee in accordance with his seniority standing."

The Union withdrew the grievance based upon evidence that only one (1) Welder had been scheduled on this turn for a considerable period prior to the incident giving rise to the grievance and the further evidence that no major units were then in operation.
