STATEMENT

Pursuant to proper notice a hearing was held in GARY, INDIANA, on December 17, 1963.

THE ISSUE

The grievance reads:

"The aggrieved employees, Water Tenders, #2 A. C. Station, Index No. 36-0412, allege that their job description and classification is improperly described and classified under the Manual.

The Aggrieved contend that due to the addition of new equipment and added job requirements and changed conditions, their job classification should be raised."

The relief sought reads:

"Aggrieved request the Company present a new description and higher classification for the occupation."

DISCUSSION AND DECISION

At the hearing the Union withdrew its objection to the job description. This grievance is limited to the Water Tender at the #2 A. C. Station even though the job description covers the #3 A. C. Station as well. Much of the evidence presented with reference to the Senior Water Tender is also applicable here. Water Tender does advise the Water Tender as to what to put on and how much by moving an arrow at his station. The Water Tender must then determine how he can comply with the Senior Water Tender's request. The testimony presented by the Union was not controverted that while the 3 A. C. Station fires under a set load and pattern, at the 2 A. C. Station it is necessary to take care of all swings. Natural gas is not used as a separate fuel at the 3 A. C. Station. The Arbitrator must find that since the same arguments were presented in both the grievance procedure and at the hearing the relationship to both this grievance and the grievance involving the Senior Water Tender, the same Award is proper.

AWARD

The Quickness of Comprehension factor is properly coded C-2. The Experience factor should be coded 3-C-12. The Accident Exposure factor is properly coded 2-D-6.
